The posh yet beguiling Villa Magna relaunched as a Rosewood property on the swank Paseo de la Castellana in 2021, and if the daily gathering of cosmopolitan guests and well-coiffed residents in the sublime, chocolate-colored lounge spaces is any indication, a perfect pairing was born. Although opulence abounds, common areas inhabit a subdued, open-plan setting with plush seating and ambient lighting that begets visitors to lounge and linger. The Sense spa offers innovative hair treatments and a standout Turkish marble hammam. At meal times, guests can choose between Flor y Nata's traditional afternoon tea, grilled Spanish cuisine at Las Brasas de Castellana, Michelin-star chef Jesús Sánchez's signature Cantabrian cuisine at Amós, or light tapas and cocktails at Tarde.O—the latter three offering stunning al fresco seating options.

Relaxed luxury can be found in the property's spacious rooms, which feature white interiors and linens offset by headboard feature walls in greens, grays, or reds, king-sized beds, lacquer-trimmed furnishings, marble baths and dark wood chevron-patterned flooring with matching monochrome rugs. For the ultimate splurge, reserve one of the top signature houses, Salamanca or Anglada—two mammoth modern residences that offer wrap-around terraces and all the creature comforts.

The spectacular bi-level lobby of the Four Seasons Madrid, with its neutral-hued furnishings and eye-catching curated artwork, exudes understated elegance. Built within seven classic buildings seamlessly melded together, the hotel houses a high-end shopping gallery, an expansive wellness area and 200 elegantly adorned rooms and 22 residences, many with unique elements that make extended stays feel more home than away. At Michelin-star chef Dani Garcia's namesake Dani, elevated Andalusian cuisine complements the brasseriestyle setting. Isa Restaurant and Cocktail Bar offers award-winning mixology and an amalgam of Mediterranean and Asian flavors while people-watching, art stalking (the hotel has over 1,500 pieces) and sweet snacks are the order of the day at the fabulous El Patio lobby bar.

Rounding out the extravagant offerings, spa services include a fitness center, hair salon, glass-covered heated and cold water pools, eight plush treatment rooms and a gold-dusted relaxation area. Indulge in the 60-minute El Retiro treatment, a de-stressing, deep-tissue massage journey that includes a foot-washing ritual, personalized pressure and a choice of oil scents and sounds, followed by a mini-slumber in the cocoon-like relaxation room.

Palacio de Atocha, the one-time lavish home of a high-ranking navy official, is now a retromodern 34-room boutique stay in Madrid's literary district, Las Letras. The building, constructed in 1852, retains glamorous vintage touches: a winding staircase, a granite garden fountain, wrought-iron courtyard detailing and the former carriage entrance, which mixes curiously well with the neon signage and contemporary artwork sprinkled around the premises. The restaurant, El Patio de Atocha, serves a creative fusion of international cuisines and regional products in an airy, blue canopy space with views of the property's chic pool and garden area. For local flavors, try the El 34 tavern next to the entrance, offering local meats, tapas, and cheese served with wine or the denizen favorite, vermut.

The bedrooms at Palacio de Atocha offer a real taste of palatial living: high ceilings, unique layouts, roomy beds, antique moldings, modish velvet furnishings and wall covers and black and white marble baths in rooms ranging from a generous 366 square feet to a monumental 1120 square feet. For special occasions, we suggest booking the CoolSuite, a top-floor tower room boasting sweeping terrace views, a large bath with duo shower heads, a stylish living room, and a private outdoor hot tub.

Grand and aristocratic best describe Santo Mauro, the 19th-century neoclassical Duke's

The Madrid Edition's design aesthetic embraces you from the moment you enter the dark oakpaneled reception area, where you're greeted by

a magnificently sculpted spiral staircase, your guide to the sleek spaces awaiting inside. The 200 rooms, including 23 suites, are all dressed in fashionable white and cream, with backlit headboards inspired by the 18th-century baroque portal out front and glam elements like faux-fur throws and head-to-toe drapery.

The Lobby Bar, the nucleus of the hotel, is offset by a pool table made with a slab of white marble and a cobalt blue top, a U-shaped sofa, brass stools, three-tier ornament shelving, bespoke furnishings and a copper-tinted bar adorned with a caged bottle display. A pink-kissed corridor leads to the first of two restaurants. Jerónimo, where Mexican-inspired cuisine is served in four distinct settings. Design notables include a double-long green bar, canary yellow banquettes, and specially designed light fixtures. The rooftop houses Oroya, a Peruvian fusion restaurant housed in a gorgeous vertical garden space boasting a shock of bold colors. The eatery leads to the wisteria-filled pergola pisco bar terrace and the double-size swimming pool with in-water loungers and majestic sunset views.

Situated in Madrid's tony Golden Triangle of Art, home to the famed Prado, Reina Sofia, and Thyssen-Bornemisza museums and just a short jaunt to El Retiro Park, the Mandarin Oriental Ritz, Madrid seamlessly displays all the glitz and glamour that typifies the Belle Epoque era. Deessa, the Michelin-star jewel of the epicurean crown, takes diners on a gourmet journey through Dacosta's signature creations. For a splurge-worthy, multi-sensory experience, don't miss the indulgent, three-hour Historic Menu with masterful plating so exquisite it's like eating works of art.

The wellness area is the true standout here—an intimate space highlighted by a rectangular circuit pool fitted with paneled woods and neutral patterned walls. This tranquil facility comprises a tiny techno gym, a Turkish hammam with aromatic eucalyptus scents and four treatment rooms. Premium spa brands Natura Bissé and Comfort Zone are used for all services tailored for him, her or for couples, and treatments are made-to-measure and can be purchased in packs of up to 15 for future use. For a wondrous experience, try the Complete Diamond, a 120-minute head-to-heel face and body treatment designed to exfoliate, moisturize and rejuvenate.

area and event space. Meal options include
Younique Restaurant Arts Club, serving
inventive Mediterranean cuisine alongside a
rotation of art exhibits and Celicioso, a "bakery"
featuring gluten-free sweet and savory treats.
For signature tipples and weekend
entertainment, try the chic Padrino Cocktail Bar,
while the 24-hour à la carte breakfast is always a
good idea—dancing 'til dawn can work up quite
the appetite, after all.

Inaugurated in 1912, the Westin Palace exudes timeless elegance and grace. From the classical façade facing the mythical Neptune Fountain to (i) BETA

the 17th-century tapestries in common areas to
La Rotunda Restaurant's crystal chandelier
hanging down from the ornate stained glass Art
Nouveau cupola, guests here are transported to a
world of regal sophistication. Typical Spanish
bites are served with old-world flair in this
storied setting and are accompanied by seasonal
live opera performances on Sundays. For
unwinding and socializing, the Museo Bar,
styled after a typical British gentleman's club,
serves all the classics in a wood-paneled space
with posh seating in dark green leather.


At 138 years young, the Gran Hotel Inglés is the oldest hotel in Madrid and has hosted no shortage of legendary names, including Henri

BETA

Matisse and Virginia Woolf. The property's central location is steps from Ernest
Hemingway's favorite haunts, as well as the popular Paseo del Arte. Then there's the décor, particularly the splendid LobByto Bar, a design marvel boasting Art Deco furnishings and a bronze-trimmed island bar with a hanging liquor cabinet. This generous space multitasks as a discreet guest check-in area, themed live music host, afternoon tea service and a weekend brunch hot spot. Guests and denizens can also stop by for traditional tapas and signature cocktails like El Retiro, a heady mix of vodka, limoncello, grenadine and vanilla syrup topped with lemon foam.

The 48 rooms are crisp, airy (some street facing) and modern, with sprinkles of snazzy 1920s deco detailing on walls, lamps and textile motifs. That period theme carries on to the cozy Le Max Wellness Club where visitors can freshen up with a Sisley facial or take in a jacuzzi soak while recalling the day's marvelous masterpieces.

Try the multi-course Temporality tasting menu in the stylish slate-hued space preceded by a wander to the property's serene secret garden where manicured lawns and shrubbery present a perfect spot for a sun-kissed break. Fashioned after a proper English pub, The Bar completes Único's first-rate services with snacks and creative concoctions in velvet and leather surrounds, an excellent spot to review the day's fashionable finds.
